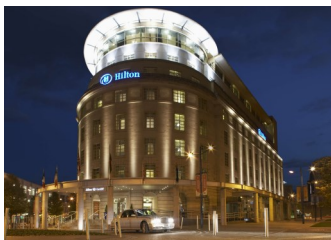

#### Plenary Session

Dr Frank Atherton - Chief Medical Officer Wales. What are the health challenges for Wales and how can the environmental health professional help to address them?
